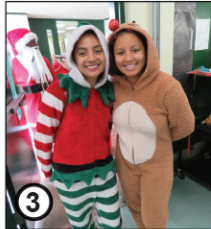

DBHS students bring Christmas joy to local kids

Every year, Deerfield Beach High School (DBHS) students from the Academy of Finance collect toys for their Little Bucks Holiday Toy Drive and bring them to local schools.

On Friday, Dec. 13, the students went to Deerfield Park Elementary school and interacted with the kids, as usual. Santa, Mrs. Claus and some elves even came along to hand out gifts to the kids. This was their 17th year.

"We had 41 kids here from the Academy of Finance," said group sponsor/teacher Frank Pizzo. "I want to thank the chap-erone, Ms. Davis, the guidance counselor, for her help and her interaction with the kids. We collected [319 toys surpassing the 250 goal]. We also will be giving to Deerfield



Beach Elementary and Park Ridge Elementary [and Cresthaven]. We will separately be delivering to the [Center for Active Aging] on Wednesday. "It's nice to see the kids giving back. Some of the kids used to go to school here. They interacted, did crafts, made Christmas trees, gingerbread men, sang songs and got presents from Santa," said Deerfield Park Elementary Pre-K teacher Amy Tinker.

Elf Bianey Rubio said, "I really enjoy the event. I want to be an elementary school teacher. It's nice to be around kids."

"It is nice to be with the kids and see the smiles on their faces. Some are more timid. It is nice to see them warm up. I like the experience," said Jeremiah Cemoin, who has been in the group for two years but was Santa for the first time this year.

"This is still my favorite event," said Mrs. Claus a.k.a. Davia Molina, president of the group, who has been involved for four years. "It warms your heart and makes you happy knowing they're happy and you made their week. It's good to give to others, especially kids."

Sullivan Park Phase II; Hillsboro SAND Update

Four distinct visions for Sullivan Park Expansion, Phase II were creatively presented by Kirk Olney, senior landscape architect of the design firm Bermello Ajamil & Partners, Inc. at the 7 p.m. Dec. 10 Deerfield Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) meeting.

Alternative 1 had expanded green space but no building for a community center, CRA offices or an interactive children's learning center.

Alternative 2 had a one-story minimalist approach—and overwhelmingly seemed to be the option neighboring Riverview Road condominium owners generally liked best. Alternative 3 and Alternative 4 both showed an elevated public facility over parking. Alternative 3 has the parking tucked under the building, so it's a story over parking. Alternative 4 also has the structure over the existing parking lot on its east side. (There is uncovered parking on the west side of Alternative 4.)

All options presented were roughly the same size in terms of square footage... Around 4500 sq. ft.," explained CRA Director Kris Mory.

Alternative 2 was selected for further design development. CRA Board Member Michael Hudak, representing District 1, which contains the CRA District, at first championed Alternative 4. He said he liked the idea of a children's interactive learning center there and would like to tie it in to Deerfield Beach Island, Sullivan Park, and maybe even the new Underwater Camera at the Pier.

Following Board Member Ben Preston's comment that the most important thing is to make sure people who live near there are comfortable with it, other board members, including Hudak, came to a consensus to give staff direction to bring back more information on Alternative 2, such as a feasibility study, cost estimate, eventually allowing vetting of a firm.
